

- 4. Low racial diversity and immigration















#### United States - White (Non-Hispanics) Births and Deaths

### Trends In Natural Population Growth/Decline Saint Louis MSA









## 6. SECOND LARGEST BLACK POPULATIONS LOSS IN THE U.S.





Top 20 Largest Black Populations in the U.S. Black Population Percent Change 2019-2022








### Change in Household Type for the Saint Louis Metropolitan Region (2019-2022)

































Saint Louis City Rate of Natural Increase






Saint Louis City Birth Rates



## What outcomes should we be prepared for?

- Short-Term
  - The MSA is expected to decline to 24
- The MSA region requires a younger demographic
  - Families with children
  - U.S. residents should be able to pursue the American Dream in St. Louis.
- Saint Louis City is forecasted to become a whitemajority city if current trends persist
  - Challenges include the declining families with children, concerns about school quality, crime rates, and the availability of affordable housing and jobs.
- Saint Louis MSA faces Demographic Hurdles
  - Deaths surpassing births
  - A declining Black population
  - Higher out-migration compared to in-migration
